## LETTER OF SUPPORT

## for MEP Sarah Wiener's draft report on the proposal for a regulation on the sustainable use of plant protection products

## TO: Dear Members of the European Parliament,

We are writing on behalf of **69 organisations across Europe** in view of the next ENVI Committee meeting on 2 March, when MEP Sarah Wiener will present the draft report on the European Commission proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council on the Sustainable Use of Plant Protection Products (SUR) and amending Regulation (EU) 2021/2115.

Signatories of this letter closely follow the work on the draft proposal for a Regulation on the Sustainable Use of Plant Protection Products. On multiple occasions and in different ways, we expressed our gravest concerns regarding the actions to water down, delay or retract the proposal.

As environmental, health, farmers and water sector organisations, including the organisers of the European Citizens Initiative (ECI) Save Bees and Farmers<sup>1</sup>, we welcome MEP Wiener's analysis that makes important steps forward in **addressing the biodiversity crisis** and the urgent need to act on it to ensure long-term food security. The mandatory implementation of Integrated Pest Management (IPM), as well as setting strong and binding pesticide use and risk reduction targets is a prerequisite to addressing accelerated species extinction and loss of ecosystem services, thus ensuring long-term food security, and to addressing health impacts linked to pesticide use.

The successful ECI Save Bees and Farmers, representing 1,1 million European citizens, calls for even stronger measures, including reduction targets of 80% for all pesticides by 2030 and a full phase-out of synthetic pesticides by 2035. PAN Europe and other environmental and health organisations stress among more the need for mandatory IPM and a 100% reduction of the more hazardous pesticides by 2030.

The report takes important steps in responding to guidelines and recommendations of a wide scientific community. FAO<sup>2</sup> and other UN agencies, IPCC<sup>3</sup>, IPBES<sup>4</sup> and other institutions stress that business as usual is not an option if we want to safeguard the future of farmers, biodiversity and clean water, while ensuring a healthy, climate-resilient and profitable food production system<sup>5</sup>. The urgency to move forward with the SUR with binding targets is stressed by 739 scientists in their call for ambitious Sustainable Use of Pesticides Regulation<sup>6</sup>.

SUR is an important element to achieve the European Green Deal goals. Citizens have been calling repeatedly for strong pesticide reductions throughout the EU for many years.
