Ministers must push real CAP reform to protect EU water and soil resources

Informal farm minister meeting must recognise potential of organic farming systems to deliver sustainability benefits under CAP

Brussels, 10/09/12 – On the occasion of today's Informal Council of EU Farm Ministers¹, where the management of the EU's land, soil and waters resources are discussed, the IFOAM EU Group² reminds the Ministers that the Common Agricultural Policy (CAP) budget must be used to effectively ensure the shift towards a sustainable food system, especially as financial means are under pressure as well as natural resources.

Christopher Stopes, President of the IFOAM EU Group, said: "The interdependence between farming and our natural resources is the key to ensuring our long-term food security. This serves to highlight the urgency of confronting major environmental challenges facing EU food production. Organic farming is well placed to respond to challenges such as water management, soil protection and climate change because it provides a system approach to resource efficiency and climate action³, as well as offering solutions to drive greater sustainability across the sector. Therefore **Ministers must ensure that discussions on these critical issues and the CAP reform are followed by concrete actions that can truly shift EU agriculture towards real and effective sustainability, with a clear emphasis on organic farming and rural development measures which continue to offer the most potential to deliver targeted sustainable outcomes."**

Marco Schlüter, Director of the IFOAM EU Group, added: "EU citizens demand value for their tax money. This means the transformation of the next CAP into a **greener and smarter farming policy, as demonstrated by the GoodFoodMarch** to Brussels⁴. It is crucial that Ministers respond to the citizens' demands by re-focusing the new CAP so that it address the major agricultural and environmental challenges facing both farmers and society at large. This can be achieved firstly by significant greening of all CAP payments and secondly by prioritising organic farming and high nature value farming systems. The Cypriot EU Presidency recently stated that cuts to the EU Budget 2014-2020, in particular CAP funding for Pillar II, are inevitable. Farm Ministers must now show that the new CAP can set EU food and farming on the right path towards full sustainability by 2020 to guarantee sufficient funding, especially for rural development measures that are crucial for shaping the farming of the future."
